

CAN ANY DOG BE AN ASSISTANCE DOG?

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WHAT DOES AN ASSISTANCE DOG LOOK LIKE?

An assistance dog can be any breed, size, colour, or type of dog. 19 However, an assistance dog usually wears a jacket which identifies them as working. The jacket can be n. any colour of the rainbow or style. You may have seen some that say, 'hearing dog', 'guide dog' or 'medical alert dog'. An assistance dog may also wear a bandana, harness, or something on their lead. hazel - dawn

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WHAT IS A MEDICAL ALERT DOG?

A medical alert doggie uses their nose and sense of smell to notice when their owner's body changes.

Because the owner has a disability this change may be dangerous.

So, the doggie can let the owner know so they can keep safe.

Please don't touch, feed, or distract a working doggie as they might miss an important change.
